antimicrobial resistance and distributed energy resource implementation in a region with deep ties to fossil fuel production, just to name a few issues tackled by students in the course.

Often, in the workplace, there is an inclination to jump directly to finding solutions before thoroughly understanding issues and their roots. With systems thinking, the exploration of problems and the interconnectedness of related issues **are** the focal points, which can make for more informed decision-

prevent siloing and lead to healthier organizations (Peters, 2022).

Map the System is a global competition, supported by the Skoll Centre for Social Entrepreneurship at the Saïd Business School, University of Oxford, that encourages students to use systems thinking concepts and principles to tackle social or environmental issues they are passionate about, with a focus on understanding vs. solving. Each team submission includes: 1. a visual systems map; 2. a summary of research findings and detailed bibliography; and 3. a 10-minute verbal presentation followed by Q&A with the judges. The program has run since 2015, and is open to current and recent graduates of higher educational institutions from
