**RESOLUTION ON PROTECTING THE INTERESTS OF AMERICA'S LIBRARIES
UNDER THE GATS**

- WHEREAS, The General Agreement on Trade in Services (GATS) among the Member governments of the World Trade Organization (WTO) addresses all services that are not specifically exempted;
- WHEREAS, The GATS excludes government services, which includes those supplied "neither from a commercial basis nor in competition with other suppliers";
- WHEREAS, Interested parties and other WTO Members might argue that some services provided by publicly supported libraries are not fully covered by the excluded government services;
- WHEREAS, A WTO Member may agree to provide "adequate and effective protection" of GATS services in the form of a schedule of specific commitments, including "National Treatment obligations" that require a WTO Member to provide foreign services no less favorable treatment than the Member provides to like domestic services and suppliers;
- WHEREAS, The United States government has agreed to make available to certain sectors on its schedule of commitments and has agreed, with regard to subsidies, generally to comply with GATS National Treatment obligations;
- WHEREAS, Interested parties and other WTO Members might attempt to argue that the United States should, in accordance with its National Treatment obligations for subsidies, either eliminate governmental assistance for some services provided by publicly supported libraries or provide equivalent assistance for services offered by foreign entities; and
- WHEREAS, The American Library Association wishes to protect the GATS obligations of the United States, under the GATS, otherwise, in particular, the ability of publicly supported and funded libraries to provide free library services; and
- WHEREAS, The United States Trade Representative has advised ALA that his Office does not intend to diminish the role of public libraries in this country, nor to diminish governmental support for libraries' services, and his Office will engage in a dialogue with ALA on these issues; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED,** That the American Library Association shall work with the Office of the United States Trade Representative, ALA, and otherwise, by the federal government as necessary, to ensure that local, state and federal governmental bodies can support the efforts of publicly supported and nonprofit libraries to serve the needs of America's schools and communities for access to information in whatever forms and by whatever means technology may allow, in coming years; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the American Library Association shall work with the Office of the United States Trade Representative, and other like wise, lobby the federal government as necessary, to ensure that publicly supported and non-profit libraries will be considered "services supplied in the course of trade" in accordance with Article 16 of the GATS, and therefore justify the scope of the GATS; and, shall further

RE-SOLVED, That the American Library Association will share this resolution with the other national library associations and with the International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions.
