Whereas, the establishment of any policies governing internal free speech and assembly during ALA conferences and meetings must uphold the values of intellectual freedom, free expression, and peaceful assembly;

Whereas, any policies restricting freedoms of expression during ALA conferences and meetings should be implemented only after wide consultation throughout the Association;

Whereas, the ALA Conference Services Office recently posted additional language in the “Statement on Appropriate Conduct at ALA Conferences” establishing a free speech zone called “The Square” during ALA conferences and meetings;

Whereas, the additional language about “The Square” had not been widely shared across ALA before being added to the “Statement on Appropriate Conduct at ALA Conferences;”

Whereas, the “Square” language was quickly removed due to membership opposition to such an abruptly imposed and restrictive policy;

Resolved, that the American Library Association Council:
