


Hello, everyone!

Endowment Fund Nears \$40,000 Mark

As of March 31, 2005, GLBTRT's endowment fund has a balance of \$38,289.08, representing an increase of approximately 25% (\$7558.62) compared to one year ago. We will soon meet ALA's \$40,000 minimum principal required in order to begin using the interest. However, to fully support both the "Stonewall – Israel Fishman Award for Nonfiction" and the "Barbara Gittings Award for Literature" we will need a minimum balance of at least \$75,000. Interest earned on the endowment funds will be rolled over into the principle until we reach the \$75,000 mark.

General Fund Balance

As of March 31, 2005, the general fund has a net asset balance of \$17,347.26 (excluding endowment funds), representing a decrease of approximately 10.7% from last year. This decrease is due to the fact that all recent donations have been made to the endowment fund. The increase in membership dues should compensate for the loss of gifts into the general fund.

As of March 31, 2005, dues collected are \$4305.61, representing an increase of 16.5% from last year.

Finally, I would like to congratulate Dustin Larmore for being elected Treasurer of the GLBTRT.

In Chicago, the Gay and Lesbian Pride Parade is an institution. It's a huge event surrounded by excited, friendly crowds, and it's scheduled during ALA Annual.

The parade starts Sunday, June 26, starting at noon from the corner of Halsted and Belmont. The parade will go north on Halsted, then south along Broadway, then east on Diversey to Cannon Drive before ending at the official rally site in Lincoln Park. Members of GLBTRT will be walking with a contingent from the Gerber-Hart Library and Archives. If you just want to watch, not walk, get to the parade route early because the sidewalks fill up fast.

The 2004 parade drew an estimated 400,000 spectators and had floats, decorated vehicles and walking contingents representing 239 businesses, organizations, politicians and individuals. During June, GLBT organizations, shops and bars pull out all stops to celebrate Pride throughout the city—but particularly in Boystown and Andersonville. On this tour you will be introduced to the Leather Archives & Museum (LA&M) staff, view our exhibit spaces, and tour the brand new Teri Rose Memorial Library. This unique collection of artifacts, publications and archival materials focuses on the many aspects, individuals and groups that make up the Leather/ Fetish community. Several members of the GLBTRT volunteer at the Leather Archives and Museum, helping preserve an important part of our history.

In August 1991, the Leather Archives & Museum was incorporated in the state of Illinois. Until 1996, the Leather Archives and Museum appeared in public only as exhibits at International Mr. Leather in Chicago and at occasional events outside the Chicago area. In 1996, a storefront home for the Leather Archives & Museum was opened in Chicago. Much larger exhibits were mounted in this space, but the collection outgrew the space very rapidly.
